 - Junior School: 90 tablets and storage and charging facility to compliment the 30 that they have. This now means that there will be 30 tablets for use by each year group who will share them between the 3 classes.
 - o Junior School: 6 Honeywell rain jackets for staff for wet weather play and sports outings
 - Infant school: Update sound system in Infant Hall, update computer hardware for Nursery, create a shade area in Nursery garden, upgrade the hall display boards

Infants: The defibrillator has arrived and will be set up and kept in the office. In 2017/18 it was agreed that the PTFA would fund the purchase of a defibrillator to have on site in case of emergency.
